

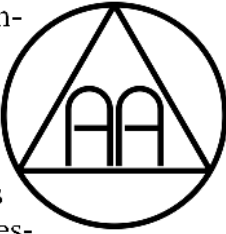
Orion Education and Training

Orion offers an on-site free diploma completion program by allowing inmates to attend courses while housed in the facility. Upon enrollment in the program, students are assigned an instructor to assist them with academic tutoring, effective time management strategies, test proctoring and post-secondary planning. Instructors are Kansas licensed teachers. At their initial training session, a graduation plan will be developed that will outline all courses needed to satisfy their diploma requirements while incarcerated.



Alcoholics Anonymous (AA)

Alcoholics Anonymous is a faith-based mutual help organization for people who want to stop drinking and stay sober. The AA approach is based on a set of principles that emphasizes personal responsibility and honesty, known as "The Twelve Steps." The Twelve Steps program of ongoing drug rehabilitation and self-improvement is achieved through attending meetings, finding and maintaining sponsors and relationships, prayer, and meditation as part of the recovery process.



SafeHouse Workshops

Through a partnership with Butler County SafeHouse, domestic violence workshops are held weekly for the female inmates in the facility. Focusing on domestic violence, child abuse and sexual assault and



abuse, the educational workshops are designed to empower women to leave harmful circumstances and educate them both on services offered by the SafeHouse and similar facilities.

Substance Abuse Center of Kansas (SACK)

Substance Abuse Center of Kansas (SACK) conducts drug and alcohol assessments, recommends treatment, both inpatient and outpatient, provides counseling, group peer-to-peer support, and individual peer to peer support. They provide programs to help individuals with getting identification and social security cards, as well as housing. They can work with the client, the courts, your attorney and court services.



National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI)

National Alliance on Mental Illness is a grassroots mental health organization that provides advocacy, education, support, and public awareness so that all individuals and families affected by mental illness can build better lives. Their outreach program within our facility provide education and support for inmates through organized group support classes while in custody and teach coping skills.



South Central Mental Health (SCMH)

Our facility works with South Central Mental Health of Butler County to help organize and set up programs both inside and outside of our facility to address a person's psychological health in addition to their physical health. The coordina-

tion of these programs allows an inmate, upon release to have access to services immediately including clinical and counseling services, medication management, crisis services, substance abuse and addiction as well as case management.



Thrive

Thrive is a grouping of community programs dedicated to reducing poverty and promoting individual success, well-being, and development. The program helps individuals build their resources for a better future story for themselves, their families, and their communities. During classes, investigators are given a non-judgemental look at the life they are living and to begin to plan for a new life. Topics of discussion include emotional strength, financial, mental, spiritual, and physical resources, support systems, role models, and knowledge of hidden rules of economic class. After 16 weeks of classes, participants are matched with an ally (from the middle or upper-class) who is willing to walk through the participant on their journey out of poverty.

Bible studies and worship services

Various worship services, Bible studies, and Catholic services are held weekly within the facility. These programs aim to provide spiritual support, guidance, and a connection to faith for inmates.



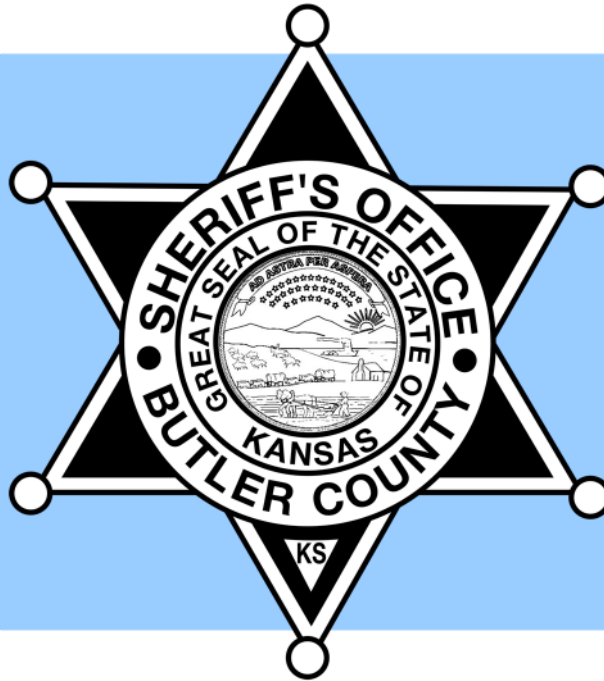
